


#### WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

The Usangu Wetlands are the source to the Great Ruaha River and Rufiji River systems, which eventually reach the Indian Ocean near the Mafia Archipelago. It is the lifeblood to southern Tanzania's wildlife areas.

A lack of protection and unregulated agriculture has led to the Great Ruaha River running dry, threatening southern Tanzania's wildlife.

Although Usangu was finally included within the Ruaha National Park in 2008 there has been **no conservational presence in the area** until now.




### WHAT IS ASILIA DOING?

- A huge part of our efforts in Usangu are focused around protecting species, restoring habitats and protecting key biological diversity
- Teamed up with TAWIRI and TANAPA to conduct a wildlife census.
- We have successfully collared roan, sable and lion, allowing conservationists to track these animals and learn
  more about their unique habitats and behaviours.
- Once we have a better understanding of the biodiversity and concentration of wildlife, we will be able to influence conservational policy
- We're hoping to develop a more robust water management plan with local government to safeguard this
  crucial water source
- We're **engaging and supporting the communities** to allow mutual benefit and reduce human wildlife conflict



- Game package only
- 2024 rates —Approx. \$700 per person per night sharing a double tent on game package.

#### WILDLIFE IN USANGU

- A unique corner of Ruaha National Park in terms of wildlife experiences and density - species are still being discovered as part of the wildlife audit.
- Predators include lion, cheetah, leopard and wild dog
- Large herds of plains game including Masai giraffe, plains zebra, eland, roan and sable antelope, kudu and many more. The vast floodplains are home to the largest herds of topi in Africa, groups of over one thousand are often seen.
- Extraordinary birding notable species include the endemic Ruaha chat, rare riverine and wetland species such as the Pel's fishing owl and the wattled crane.
- Much of the wildlife has never seen a vehicle or people before so, whether they are out on a game drive, guided walk or boating safari, guests get the unique opportunity to be part of the habituation process.



### **DOUGLAS BELL ECO RESEARCH STATION**

Central hub for all research and conservation efforts in the Usangu Wetlands.


Allows guests to engage with researchers and develop a deeper understanding of the vital work being performed in the region.

### The guided tour includes:

- Overview of the research project
- Insights into the anti-poaching efforts in Usangu
- Access to the highlights of the biodiversity study (camera trap footage)
- Access to the predator ID hub
- Explanation about how animal collaring works
- Latest insights into the Telemetry data of the collared animals in the region
- And so much more....

Various guest experiences can be organised in collaboration with the research station. The experiences on offer will vary depending on which researchers are on the ground at any given time.





### **NYERERE NATIONAL PARK**

- In late 2019 the Tanzanian Government re-classified and expanded the already colossal Selous Game Reserve
- An area of approximately 31,000 km2 (that's the size of Belgium!) is now under the protection of TANAPA
- Nyerere National Park is now the largest national park in Africa
- Now offering the same incredible activities, game viewing and unparalleled wilderness just under a new name



### WHY CHOOSE ROHO YA SELOUS?

- Varied activities including walking safaris, game drives and boating safaris
- Peaceful waterside location, close to a key waterway which links Lake Manze to Lake Nzerakera, in the heart of the photographic sector of Nyerere National Park
- Diverse landscape of swamps, rivers, and lakes with a good concentration of wildlife, in particular wild dog


